# Water quality and the effects of fertilizers

With the heat this summer, we had an especially bad year with algae. Again, we used **NutraFX Algae** (a safe and natural product). On learning of our added challenges, the company came to help out. Again it worked but we had to use extra applications (the company donated their time and product). We plan to use the product again next year and will need four volunteers on Sunset Lake, two volunteers on Twin Lake and one volunteer for each of the ponds to administer the product. We continue to ask residents to assist us to help find alternatives to pesticides and fertilizers. A major factor that contributes to the problem of high levels of algae in our lakes is the *run-off from fertilizer used* on lawns throughout the community. The nitrates and phosphates continue to enter into Twin Lake in significant volumes at two "hot spots" which then feeds into Sunset Lake which also has three additional culverts feeding runoff water. Without *eliminating* the use of fertilizers on our lawns this will be a **never** ending battle. The only permanent solution lies in total eradication of the use of traditional fertilizers.

We also are experiencing an increase in the duck population on Twin Lake. Ducklings are cute but as the numbers continue to increase the water quality on our lakes will deteriorate with increased fecal matter and parasites. Accordingly we ask residents - **Please do not feed the ducks!!!** 

### **Covenants**

Being a resident of Sunset Lakes confers many benefits and privileges. However, with those benefits come certain responsibilities, as dictated, primarily, by the *DEED RESTRICTIONS FOR SUNSET LAKES DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION COVENANTS AND RESTRICTIONS* which can be found online at <a href="http://www.sunsetlakes.ca/sunsetlakes/sunset\_index.htm">http://www.sunsetlakes.ca/sunsetlakes/sunset\_index.htm</a>.

We realize there are extenuating circumstances and you may need an exception to a covenant for a short period of time. If that is the case let us know and we can work out a solution. Some of the perennial observations made to the Board are –

- Driveways that have not been paved (or equivalent type surface) within one year of construction.
- Trailers, boats, RVs, etc. continue to be stored on driveways or in yards for prolonged periods (greater than a week).

### Vandalism

Vandalism, although reduced this year, continues to be a problem in the neighbourhood. Residents have experienced car break-ins, late night alcohol parties in the parks, and several other inconvenient nuisances. It is important that we actively address vandalism by reporting all incidents to the police. The police have encouraged us to report incidents to help them identify and address problem areas.
